

## Traffic snapshot

- Total MAHB System (including Istanbul SGIA) registered 8.6% growth for 2016 with 10.2mil passenger movements for September 2016 over the same month last year.
- September registered the first double-digit growth (12.3%) for Malaysia Airports passenger movements in 2016.
- Almost all MAHB airports recorded positive with ten airports registering a double-digit growth between 11% to 26%.
- KLIA Main Terminal continues to record double digit growth (35.3%) in passengers over September 2015.
- Kota Kinabalu International Airport registered the highest growth for international passenger traffic at 46% over September 2015.
- Fourth quarter airlines' seat capacity for Malaysia Airports is in the positive territory and is expected to provide buoyant growth.
- Istanbul SGIA's passenger traffic is showing signs of improvement.

### **MAHB system's airport traffic performance**

MAHB system of airports (including Istanbul SGIA) recorded 10.2million passengers in September 2016, an 8.6% growth over September 2015. Domestic traffic recorded 5.7million passengers with 6.9% growth while the international traffic recorded 4.5million passengers with a y-o-y increase of 10.9% compared to the same period a year ago. On year-to-date basis, the total MAHB system (with Istanbul SGIA) registered 4.8% growth with 87.7million passengers. Overall aircraft movements increased by 0.02% with international and domestic movements registering a growth of 3.9% and decline of 2.1% respectively over September 2015.

On the domestic front, Malaysia airports registered 7.5million passengers in September 2016, a 12.3% year-on-year growth over September 2015. International sector recorded 3.6million passengers, a growth of 15.3% while domestic sector recorded 3.9million passengers with a 9.8% increase. Overall aircraft movements increased by 0.2% for the same period. There was an increase of 5.6% and a decrease of 2.7% respectively for international and domestic aircraft movements in Malaysia over September 2015. Overall average load factors improved to 74.7% in September 2016, an increase by 5.9 percentage points compared to the same month last year.

KLIA passenger movements recorded a 15% increase in September 2016 registering 4.4million passenger movements. KLIA Main Terminal traffic grew by 35.3% while klia2 declined by 0.9%. The record double-digit growth of KLIA Main Terminal was partly attributable to improvement in Malaysia Airlines domestic traffic, other new airlines international traffic contribution and Malindo Air's movements after the transfer to KLIA Main Terminal since 15 March 2016. The year-to-date passenger traffic for KLIA Main terminal recorded 18.3million passengers, an increase of 6.5% over the same corresponding period last year, while klia2 recorded 20.1million, an increase of 5.3% over the same period last year. Overall aircraft movements at KLIA increased by 3.5% over September 2015. International aircraft movements at KLIA registered an increase of 4.6% while domestic aircraft movements registered a growth of 1.4%.

Istanbul SGIA passengers declined by a marginal 0.4% in September 2016 over the same period last year. The international sector declined by 3.3% while the domestic sector increased by 1.1%.

### **Overview of traffic**

The overall passenger traffic growth of 8.6% for the MAHB system of airports in September was mainly driven by MAHB's airports in Malaysia. Malaysia's MAHB airports' 12.3% growth in traffic for September is the first double-digit growth for 2016. Almost all MAHB's airports recorded positive growth with ten airports registering double-digit growth in the range of 11% to 25%. All

the five international airports registered high growth rates ranging from 10% to 46%. Kota Kinabalu International Airport registered the highest growth for international traffic over September 2015 at 46%. In addition, Kota Kinabalu International Airport grew by 11% for the domestic traffic.

For September 2016, 21 carriers recorded double-digit growth for the international traffic over September 2015. These airlines experienced passenger traffic increases in the range of 12% to 90% over September 2015. The traffic was further supported by new foreign airlines that were not operating in 2015. All the local airlines experienced double-digit growth. Malindo Air grew by 50%, while AirAsia and Malaysia Airlines Berhad registered a 10% growth respectively. This is the first positive growth for Malaysia Airlines Berhad for 2016. All Regions other than Europe recorded good growth from 9% to 29%.

### **Third quarter traffic**

Total MAHB system handled 31.4million passengers in the third quarter of 2016 registering a 5.8% growth over the same corresponding period last year. Domestic movements increased by 5.0% while international movements increased by 6.7%. Third quarter passenger movements was 10.4% and 12.6% higher than the second and first quarters of 2016 respectively. Malaysia's traffic for the third quarter registered 23million passenger movements, 9.4% increase over 2015. With respect to growth, this was the highest among all quarters in 2016, as compared to 3.7% in first quarter and 0.1% in the second quarter. Istanbul SGIA performance was affected by the bombing incidents and political uncertainties in Turkey especially in the third quarter. Though the third quarter traffic was higher than previous two quarters, year-on-year, the third quarter registered a 3.1% decline in traffic over third quarter 2015.

### **Year to date traffic**

MAHB's total system of airports handled 87.7million passengers up to September 2015 registering a 4.8% growth over the same corresponding period last year. Domestic movements increased by 4.4% while international movements increased by 5.3%. Malaysia Airports registered 4.4% growth in passenger movements, while Istanbul SGIA registered 5.9%. Aircraft movements declined by 0.2% over the same period last year.

### **Industry Outlook**

IATA's forecast for global passenger growth remains at 6.2% for 2016 and 8.5% for Asia Pacific. There are some positive developments in the Malaysia market with the aggressive growth of not only many foreign airlines but also the local airlines. Malindo Air and AirAsia Group registered positive growth while Malaysia Airlines had a positive turn around for domestic sector from July 2016. Malaysia Airlines Berhad registered a first positive for international traffic in September with a 6.3% increase.

It should be noted that the airlines' seat capacity increase which remained in the negative for the first 8 months, indicates a net positive of 4.8% for the last quarter. There was a double-digit increase in passenger traffic in many sectors including China, Japan, India, Iran, South Korea, Turkey, New Zealand, Qatar, Taiwan, Jordan, Singapore, Maldives and Vietnam. The airlines and destination growth that has picked momentum will likely hold at least until the end of the year.

International Monetary Fund (IMF) has in October 2016 projected a 4.3% growth for Malaysia in 2016 and 4.6% in 2017. Though IMF has revised its estimate for the global economy downwards by 0.1% compared to the April estimate, Asia and ASEAN economies are expected to be improving as they move into 2017.

In view of the optimism as well as increasing average load factor and the lower base of 2015, 2016 is expected to end with a relatively higher growth than the 2.5% forecasted over 2015.

The travel warnings to Turkey and visa requirements may hinder Istanbul SGIA's growth. There has been some improvement in numbers for September but it is not enough to reverse the negative cumulative. In view of the foregoing events in Turkey, we expect Istanbul SGIA growth to be mainly driven by the domestic sector.

MAHB including Istanbul SGIA's passenger traffic for fourth quarter is likely to have the best performance and this is expected to result in an optimistic growth for the whole of 2016.
