

Traffic snapshot

- MAHB's network of airports recorded a total of 4.9million passenger movements, despite subdued air travel demand during the Ramadhan fasting month both in Malaysia and Turkey.
- International passenger movements continued to grow, depicting signs of a gradual traffic
 recovery against a mix backdrop where travel restrictions and protocols are slowly relaxed in
 few countries while others are still restricted in the Asia Pacific region. Nevertheless, April
 passenger volume recorded a new high in passenger movements to-date, surpassing March
 2022 volume that was initially the highest passenger movements recorded since the closure
 of borders in March 2020.
- Malaysia international passenger movements reached a new high, recording more than 600,000 passengers with an average load factor of 55.8%, the highest average load factor recorded since March 2020. The further easing of COVID-19 Standard of Procedures (SOP) from 1st May 2022 is expected to further facilitate the resumption of international traffic in the months to come.
- Istanbul SGIA's international passenger movements continued to register above 1million passengers despite the ongoing conflict between Russia and Ukraine and the low demand during Ramadhan month.
- The momentum for domestic passenger movements slowed down in April, compared to the
 first three months in 2022 due to low air travel demand for Malaysia and Turkey during the
 fasting month. Nevertheless, traffic showed an upswing towards the end of April as air travel
 demand peaked towards the long week break of Aidilfitri celebrations.
- Malaysia daily average domestic passenger movements registered a new high towards the end of April, reaching more than 100,000 passenger a day for the first time and the momentum continued to the first nine days of May.
- Istanbul SGIA domestic passenger movements equally remain resilient. Daily average domestic passenger movements grew by 5.5% compared to March daily average passenger movements. The first nine days of May recorded an increase of 22.4% in daily average passenger movements compared to the month of April.

Overview of traffic

April passenger movements for the total MAHB network of airports continued to show resilience, recording 4.9million passengers, which is the second highest traffic registered for 2022, against a backdrop of a more subdued air travel demand due to the fasting month. On a positive note, traffic peaked and recorded a new high towards the end of April and continued to the first nine days of May backed by strong pent-up demand in conjunction with the Aidilfitri celebrations both in Malaysia and Turkey.

Malaysia traffic resurgence was facilitated by the reopening of borders from 1st April 2022, the Aidilfitri week-long holidays, and the country's transition towards an endemic phase. International passenger movements grew by 53% in April compared to March 2022 reaching more than 600,000 passengers for the first time. The further relaxing of COVID-19 SOP from 1st May 2022, is expected

to ease international travellers' journey and would further facilitate the resumption of international traffic in the months to come. It is encouraging to note that the first nine days of May's average load factor recorded a new high of 63.3%, an increase of 7.5 percentage points compared to the month of April (55.9%). AirAsia and Scoot Airlines are the first international flights to resume services to Kota Kinabalu International Airport on 16th and 29th April respectively, after two years of lull period. Among the airlines that have resumed services in April at Penang International Airport and KLIA are Thai AirAsia, AirAsia X, Vietjet Air and AirAsia to Bangkok, Incheon, Hanoi and Hat Yai. Royal Brunei Airlines has resumed services to Kota Kinabalu from Bandar Seri Begawan from 6th May 2022, utilising Airbus 320neo with two-time weekly frequencies.

Towards the end of April both international and domestic daily average passenger movements grew by 31% and 87% respectively, compared to March daily average passengers. Malaysia daily average domestic passenger movements surpassed the 100,000-mark for the first time with more than 131,000 average daily passengers in the last four days of April and continued to record above 100,000 daily passengers in the first nine days of May reaching 128,600 average daily passengers. The average daily passengers registered between January to March 2022 was approximately 81,000 passengers.

Istanbul SGIA was equally affected by the low air travel demand during the fasting month and showed similar traffic trend, recording a new high in daily average passenger movements towards the end of April. It is noteworthy that the 1.04million passenger movements registered in April is the second highest for 2022, registered during the fasting month. The upswing in traffic continued towards the first nine days of May as travellers continued to travel during the Aidilfitri season and the onset of summer season holidays.
